Question (March 29, 2018)

A number of classes have had their usual course caps split between PFW and IUFW. PFW students have already begun registering for classes and will continue to do so over the coming weeks and months. IUFW students are not expected to begin enrolling until mid-May and will continue enrolling throughout the summer. It is likely that some courses will have one side fill before the other side has filled.
