Question Time

In August 2021, PFW faculty received <u>an email from the Office of Academic Affairs</u> (OAA) stating that due to budgetary constraints, professional development account (PDA) funds will not be available for faculty to use for conferences or related travel unless a faculty submits an appeal that require processing on three levels: (1) the academic unit chair's approval (2) the college dean's review, and (3) the Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs for a final decision. Under our current extenuating circumstances (pandemic and low-enrollment), it is expected that the university takes such measures.

- 1. Could there be a more efficient appeals process for faculty to use so as not to go through multiple hoops?
- 2. Could there be a set of criteria that departments and/or Senate can develop to ensure that the appeals process is fair to all faculty who apply for funding?
- 3. As the pandemic enters its third year and since there are no tangible indications of financial growth, what plans are there for reinstituting funds toward scholarly activity/events to foster professional development for faculty?
- 4. What assurances could you give faculty that current PDA conditions and processes will not be the norm moving forward?

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
