TRIO Student-of-the-Year:

Abigail Pease

Every child has a hero—sometimes from a comic book or television series—but some lucky kids have a hero right in their own home. Abi Pease was that kind of lucky. Abi's hero, her dad, has played a huge part in shaping her life and has given her a unique perspective on fortitude and tenacity.

Abi grew up in Fort Wayne, Indiana. As a child, Abi recalls always being aware her family functioned differently from others—and her closeness to her dad was not something she took for granted.

Abi's dad was a helicopter mechanic from 1980-91 and served in the Gulf War. During his time in the service, he developed a severe form of arthritis that drastically challenged his mobility. This took a toll on him and Abi's entire family. Feelings of frustration at not being able to do things others thought dads should do was something that he felt early on; however, the story doesn't end there. When Abi's dad was unable to work traditional jobs, he pivoted his whole life and channeled all his energy in another direction. He restructured his life to stay at home and raise Abi while Abi's mom worked outside the home. And according to Abi, he did such a great job at it. Abi says having him at home helped shape her as a young adult and gave her a very special "built-in best friend" many of her peers didn't have.

Watching her dad struggle but persist taught Abi a lot about the kind of person she wanted to be and the line of work she'd like to do after college. Watching her hero overcome obstacles helped Abi learn compassion, empathy, and unconditional



love early on. All things Abi leans on in her work with others today. It is of no surprise to those who know Abi that she aspires to a career helping others one day.

The close bond Abi has with her parents influenced her decision on what college to attend. Abi chose Purdue Fort Wayne specifically because it was close to home and she could easily help her parents out when they needed her while being close to her hero best-friend.

According to Abi, "I don't let what anyone else says about me define who I am. I am a first-generation college student graduating with a bachelor's degree in Psychology. I couldn't have gotten here without the support of my friends, family, and TRIO staff." While at PFW, Abi was an active student participating in TRIO SSS, Delight Ministries, and Student Activities Board. Abi graduated in May. She plans to continue at Purdue Fort Wayne toward a Master's degree in Counseling.

TRIO NYC

In June, TRIO traveled to New York, New York for a fun filled four day trip. Day one was an early morning with students arriving at 4:30 am to check-in and load the bus. The group traveled throughout the day and arrived in New York around 5:00 pm where they their tour guide and headed to Times Square for dinner at the Hard Rock Café. The rest of the evening was spent unwinding from the long bus ride. On day two, students traveled by ferry to Liberty Island to see the Statue of Liberty. Students had pedestal access to see Lady Liberty from above. There are 215 steps—or approximately 10 stories to climb to get to the top of the pedestal. Students also had access to the Statue of Liberty Museum to learn about the history surrounding the sculpture and to view the original torch. Afterward, students traveled to neighboring Ellis Island for lunch and to visit the Ellis Island National Immigration Museum to learn about the history of American immigration. Students toured the great hall, baggage room, and viewed historic records of those who journeyed from far away in search of a new life in America. To finish the evening, students attended the Broadway musical, Wicked, a retelling of The Wizard of Oz, at the Gershwin Theatre. Day three students toured historic Radio City Music Hall and got the opportunity to meet a Rockette. Students were able to go sightseeing in Lower Manhattan, Little Italy, Chinatown, and SoHo before heading to the 9/11 Memorial and Museum. On their final day, students walked through Central Park viewing the Alice and Wonderland sculpture and the Strawberry Fields memorial. Students toured the American Museum of Natural History learning about indigenous cultures, zoology, and outer space before heading back to Fort Wayne. TRIO student, Victory Paw, summed up her experience traveling to New York City as something "many of us never thought we would get the opportunity to do" and Alicia Kingsberry echoed that visiting the sights with "some old and new faces was better than anything I would have experienced by myself."
