#### Brazile to Provide 2024 Perspective during Omnibus Presentation on Thursday

Though America's focus on political discourse seems to change by the hour, Donna Brazile has a solid idea for how she will frame her Omnibus Speaker Series presentation on Thursday in Auer Performance Hall at Purdue University Fort Wayne. She will stress three principles: the importance of civic engagement, compromise is not a dirty word, and the need for community.

"Washington is still a dynamic place," said Brazile, who teaches a weekly course at Georgetown University. "The problem is, of course, that polarization runs deep in the waters, but I still believe the American people should have some hope and optimism."

Brazile, a veteran Democratic political strategist, will present "Political Outlook: A Comprehensive Picture of What's Going on in Washington" starting at 7:30 p.m.
