

Purdue Fort Wayne Cybersecurity Team Finishes Season with No. 14 National Ranking; Highest Spot of Any University in Indiana

One of the nation's highest-ranked teams in a cybersecurity competition that just concluded was made up of six computer science majors at Purdue University Fort Wayne.

During the National Cyber League's spring 2024 season, Purdue Fort Wayne's first team finished 14th out of 1,034 total squads who participated. That was the highest place of any university in the Indiana, and among the top 2% of all teams taking part in this biannual competition. The **Cyber Power Rankings** released Friday is a list generated by Cyber Skyline in partnership with the NCL.

"This achievement not only showcases our students' highly demanded cybersecurity skills, but it also highlights our university's competitiveness on a national level," said Adolfo Coronado, chair of the Department of Computer Science. "Competitions like these are valuable opportunities for our computer science majors to prove to themselves and others that they're ready to take what they've learned in the classroom and apply it to scenarios they'll see throughout their careers. That's important."

SoE Juniors Grow with Early Classroom Experience

Holly Hullinger-Sirken continually tells her students, "We learn by doing." This is why the associate clinical professor in the School of Education at Purdue University Fort Wayne was seeking to give them practical experience before becoming student teachers.

Hullinger-Sirken asked Fort Wayne Community Schools to partner in a new program that would initiate juniors into classrooms before traditionally entering student teaching as seniors. During the past two semesters, students in Hullinger-Sirken's language arts and reading courses spent Tuesday mornings at Study Elementary. A grant from PFW's Center for the Enhancement of Learning and Teaching provided materials, among other things.

After attending a lecture in the media center, the PFW students spent two hours working with classes, small groups, and individuals, concentrating on reading. Sometimes that meant working with third grade students to help them prepare for Indiana's IREAD test.

Director of Community Research Institute Deciphers the Data

Among hundreds of experts in their field—professors, administrators, and coaches—Rachel Blakeman may be the most quoted person on the Purdue University Fort Wayne campus. As director of the **Community Research Institute** in the Doermer School of Business, Blakeman has been interviewed by the media almost 300 times since 2020 to give stories perspective and add context.

Blakeman says her job is, "The idea of helping people understand what is happening around them."

Since joining Purdue Fort Wayne in July 2017, Blakeman has been studying northeast Indiana data and trends to gain knowledge about the region, something she excelled at early in her career as a journalist, and then as a city government compliance officer and spokesperson. Earlier Entry Added at Commencement to Help All Get to Where They Need to Be

That special moment for our graduates is here—today is the day! Purdue Fort Wayne's 2024 Commencement is also an opportunity for undergraduates to celebrate what the university does to change lives for the better. All are welcome to attend.

Those wishing to enter the Coliseum's main arena before and during the 4 p.m. ceremony will participate in safety and security measures consistent with many major events across the country. All ceremony participants, students, and guests will pass through metal detectors, and bags and purses will be physically screened by security personnel. Small items such as keys, phones, and wallets may be carried by hand through one of 8–10 screening zones.

To accommodate these new steps, doors to the Coliseum will open earlier this year for ceremony participants and students, who may begin entering at 1 p.m. Guests may begin entering at 2 p.m.

The university and representatives of the Coliseum are in regular contact to review expected traffic patterns so the flow of individuals into the main arena can be completed as quickly as possible. The idea is to give everyone plenty of time to find where they need to be and the perfect seat. Check the **2024 Commencement website** for additional information.
