## Helmke Solar Panels Helping PFW Reduce Environmental Footprint

Though installation required nearly 12 months, no one seemed to notice a difference when the changeover finally happened. However, the new solar panels atop Helmke Library at Purdue University Fort Wayne will have a large environmental impact.

About a year ago, PFW received a \$135,000 grant from EBSCO Information Services Solar. The company's goal is for university libraries to implement solar arrays to reduce their environmental footprints and decrease electricity costs. Mitch Davidson, associate vice chancellor for ITS and chief information officer, applied for the grant in early 2023.

After selecting a contractor and gathering materials and equipment, the installation required less than a week. The final hookup to the library's electrical system required a four-hour power outage on Sunday.
