New Home for Mastodon Bones a True Display of PFW School Spirit

Two years after starting college in 1980, Jon Havens declared geology as his major with no idea of the everlasting impact his decision would have on Purdue University Fort Wayne. Neither did Haven's friend, Dan Brinkman, or Mike Stoller, who graduated in 2018, and more recently Whitney Hadley-Salay, B.A. '23, but their efforts are now prominently reflected on campus in a display that should endure for generations to come.

These are four students representing dozens who helped showcase and preserve the original mastodon bones from which the university gets its nickname. A display of the bones was mounted last week in the hallway between the International Ballroom and the new Herd Hideout at Walb Student Union.

Major Traffic Alert for Coliseum Boulevard Entrance to Main Campus

With Monday's start of the fall semester rapidly approaching, there's a major traffic alert the entire campus community must be aware of.

The Indiana Department of Transportation has begun work on what it's calling deck overlay preventive maintenance to the Coliseum Boulevard bridge across the St. Joseph River, which is just west of the Main Campus. Access at the Anthony Boulevard and Coliseum Boulevard entrance will be highly restricted during construction, which is scheduled to last until Sept. 16, weather permitting.

As part of the project, crews will be closing lanes and diverting traffic on Coliseum in both directions. Until further notice from INDOT, it's expected that the left turn lane on eastbound Coliseum that frequently backs up in the morning will be periodically shut down for much of the next month.

Anyone looking to drive onto campus during this time is urged to use the Crescent Avenue and St. Joe Road entrances—and adjust their schedules to reflect probable delays.

Purdue Fort Wayne Introduces Big Discount for Alumni Interested in Specific Graduate Degrees

Alumni of Purdue University Fort Wayne who received a bachelor's degree at any point in the previous five years are now eligible for a sizable tuition discount of up to 30% if they decide to return to PFW to pursue a graduate degree in one of six eligible programs: biology, engineering, mathematics, music therapy, organizational leadership, and professional communications.

The incentive is one free class per semester for the first three semesters of enrollment, a maximum of nine credits in all. PRAGS, or Propelling Recent Alumni to Graduate Studies, is the initiative's unofficial name that was coined by Sherif Elfayoumy, the Steel Dynamics Dean of the College of Engineering, Technology, and Computer Science.

With some indication that the job market is tightening, leaders at PFW want to further equip recent grads with the skills and knowledge necessary to excel in their chosen field.
