Code of Conduct; Behavioral Expectations; Drugs and Alcohol; Academic Integrity

Dear Students,

As I mentioned in my first *What it Takes* **message on Thursday**, we will be reaching out to you regularly with important information that's focused on your success as a student. This is a critical email about the conduct expectations we have for you on campus.

First and foremost, we expect members of the PFW and IUFW community to foster a concern for the common good of everyone on our campus. We may have different ideas and ways of communicating, particularly in a setting as varied as a university, but there are standards that everyone needs to follow.

Code of Student Rights, Responsibilities, and Conduct: The code informs our campus community of the general behavioral expectations that the university has for all students and outlines the procedures used to respond to complaints when standards are violated. Students are expected to read, understand, and adhere to these regulations. You can review the code **here.**

Academic Integrity: Academic integrity is expected of all students, regardless of academic year, major, or grade level. You as students are responsible for knowing how to maintain academic honesty, which includes abstaining from cheating, the appearance of cheating, and permitting or assisting in another's cheating. Violations of the code are taken seriously, and we hold students accountable when these violations occur. You should clarify any questions regarding academic misconduct or the use of artificial intelligence with the course instructor.

Title IX Harassment, Discrimination, and Retaliation Policies: We are committed to maintaining a community that recognizes and values the inherent worth and dignity of every person; fosters tolerance, sensitivity, understanding, and mutual respect among its members; and encourages each individual to strive to reach their potential.
