


## Lineup Announced for 2024–25 Omnibus Speaker Series at Purdue Fort Wayne

Contemporary themes and personal experiences will be highlighted during the 29th season of Purdue University Fort Wayne's popular Omnibus Speaker Series. The 2024–25 schedule will include topics such as the thoughts of a New York Times political podcaster; a journey through grief; brand strategy and cultural behavior; and an award-winning chef's insights about her cultural duality.

"We are so pleased to have such an outstanding lineup of speakers this season," said Jerry Lewis, vice chancellor for communications and marketing at Purdue Fort Wayne. "The Omnibus Speaker Series has been a community treasure here in Fort Wayne for almost three decades, and our speakers this year are thought-leaders who will challenge us with a diversity of ideas, perceptions, and experiences."

The new season opens Oct. 24 with Michael Barbaro, a New York Times political journalist and host of "The Daily" podcast, which is among the world's most popular with 3 million listeners.

#### Gold Top Continues to Move the Needle

Four years ago, as he became a new clinical assistant professor of music and director of popular music in the School of Music, John Buteyn was welcomed with a to-do list. At the very top—practically bolded, underlined, and italicized—was starting a record label.

Taking inspiration from Gibson's iconic Les Paul Gold Top guitar, which clearly fit well with Purdue University Fort Wayne's colors, the Gold Top Music Group was introduced on Aug. 3, 2021. Beside Buteyn and Jason Lundgren, clinical assistant professor of music industry, there was one student at the start.

Today, Buteyn and Lundgren are still the cornerstones of the Center of Excellence, but now supported by five full-time and 12 part-time faculty members working with between 80 and 100 students. Since 2021, approximately 200 students have graduated with popular music and music industry degrees.

Using the stage name "VEO," which is her middle name and her great-grandmother's first name, Hutchek's "Reflections" features nine original country and rock songs. Most deal with events from her life, showing she still has that 3-year-old's passion and fearlessness.

ScholarshipUniverse is a matching system that maximizes scholarship opportunities. It allows students to create an academic profile that enables them to connect with various internal and external sources.
