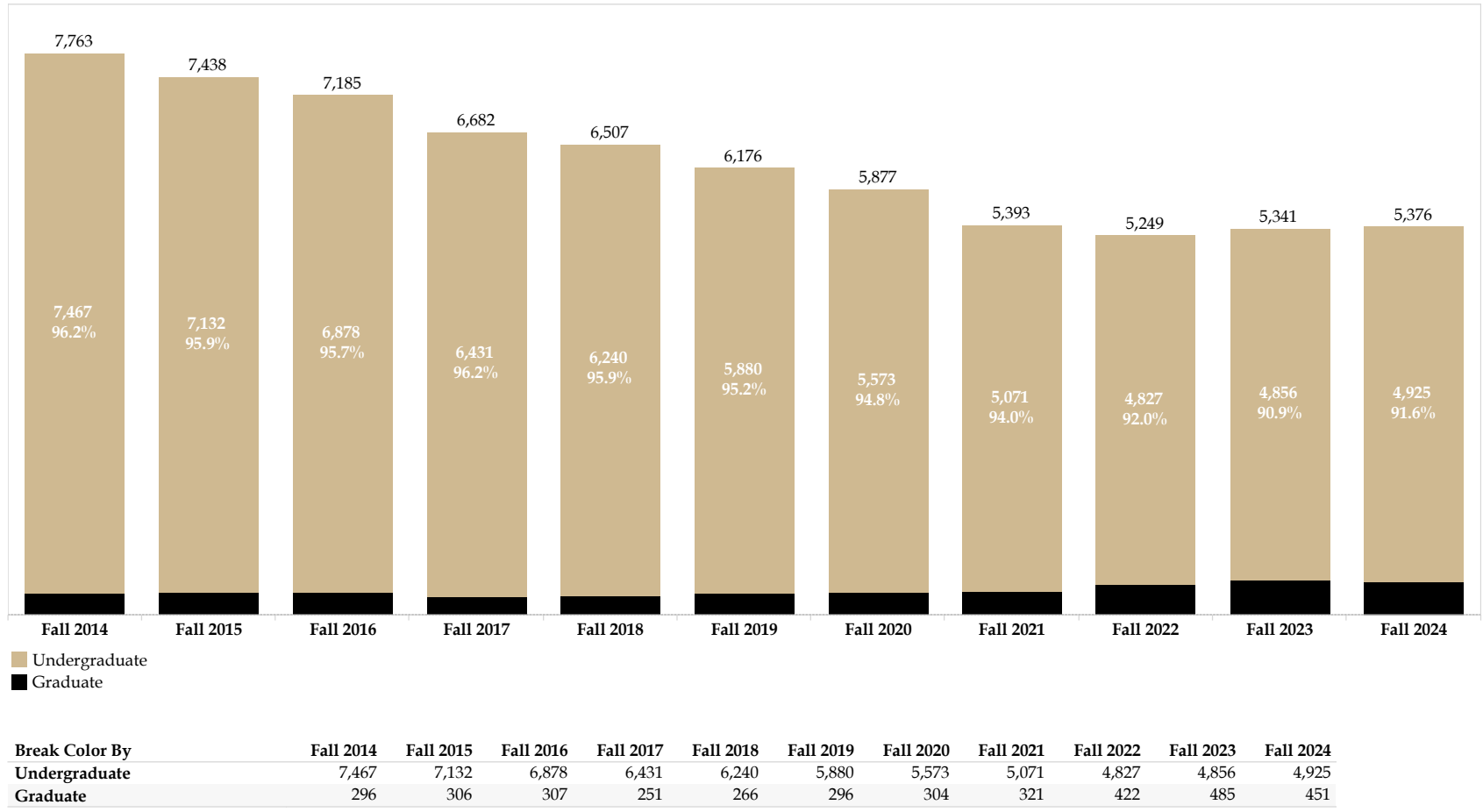

- a. Student enrollment is counted if a student is registered for at least one course on the census snapshot date for each fall semester. Student enrollment includes degree-seeking and non-degree-seeking students.
- b. Academic categorization of Undergraduate or Graduate students is based on their primary academic program of study. The Graduate level encompasses, Masters, Doctor of Nursing Practice, and Graduate Certificates. The Undergraduate level encompasses, Baccalaureates, Associates, and Undergraduate Certificates. Non-degree seeking students are identified as both Undergraduate and Graduate levels.
- c. Student's FTE is the number of credits enrolled relative to a full, or normal, load in each semester. The full-time load is 15 hours for Undergraduates and 12 hours for Graduate students. FTE is calculated by dividing the sum of total enrolled credits hours by 15 for Undergraduate and 12 for Graduate students. FTE allows Purdue Fort Wayne to compare instruction hours, regardless of the number of students enrolled.
