# Amendments to SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY PROMOTION AND TENURE COMMITTEE PROCEDURES

#### B. SCHOOL COMMITTEE

#### (Old Version)

- 1. The committee shall consist of five tenured, full or associate professors from the School. Three of the members must be full professors. Each department shall be represented on the committee, if possible.
- The Assembly of Representatives shall conduct a faculty 2. election by ranked ballot to select the five committee members who shall serve for the remainder of the academic year. The Assembly of Representatives shall conduct their election as early as possible in the Fall semester. Each department shall send the names of two qualified nominees to the Assembly by September 15 for a school-wide nomination. The ballots for full professors shall first be counted to elect three tenured full professors from different departments if possible. Then the persons receiving the greatest number of votes in the remaining departments not yet represented shall be declared elected, so that there will be balanced representation where possible. Balanced representation shall override the number of votes. When necessary a tie shall be resolved by a simple ballot.

## (Proposed Changes)

- 1. The committee shall consist of five tenured, full or associate professors faculty members from the School. Three of the members must be full professors. Each department shall be represented on the committee, if possible.
- 2. The Assembly of Representatives shall conduct a faculty election by ranked ballet voting for one of two from each department to select the five committee members who shall serve for the remainder of the academic year. The Assembly of Representatives shall conduct their election as early as possible in the Fall semester. Each department shall send the names of two qualified nominees to the Assembly by September 15 for a school-wide nomination, if available. The ballets for full professors shall first be counted to elect three tenured full professors from different departments if possible. Then the persons receiving the greatest number of votes in the remaining departments not yet represented shall be declared elected, so that there

will be balanced representation where possible.

Balanced representation shall override the number of votes. When necessary a tie shall be resolved by a simple ballot.

### (New Version)
