The TRAFFIC APPEALS BOARD has met 15 times and acted upon 250 appeals to dete. The violation was upheld in 170 of the appeals and 80 appeals were dismissed. Problems encountered by Traffic Appeals Board, Oct. 1981-March 1982:
1. Signage in Union Circle and Dock Areas considered unclear.
2. Handicapped areas not clearly defined.
3. Ticketing at Barr Street lot for "non-university business."
4. Ticketing officer does not always fill out ticket clearly.

Students are unfamiliar with parking regulations, despite folder given at time of registration. ģ

7. Visitor parking is very confusing to those unfamiliar with the campus; not enough metered spaces when registered vehicles can also use meters.

8. Removable permit causes meny violations (e.g. falls off; forget permit; borrow other people's permit)

Suggestions for correcting problems encountered:

1. Paint "no parking curb areas yellow. Yellow curbs not as unsightly as the portable NO PARKING standards now used.

2. Need a handicapped parking sign for each space; also put handicapped logo on pavement in each space.

3. Ticketing for non-university business at Barr Street Campus is too hard to enforce fairly. This rule should be rescinded.

4. Need fuller remerks on ticket for reasons for ticketing.

5. Recommend that parking regulations folder include information about the availability of and procedure for a temporary. handicapped parking permit.

2 Fringe Benefit Program:

On November 17, 1982, the speakers of the faculty forwarded to FAC a comparative study of the Fringe Benefits Programs of IU and PU, and suggested that FAC come up with a recommendation. The FAC included Vice Chancellor Carnaghi, Mr. Ferguson, and Dr. E. Leonard in its deliberations. The Vice Chancellor suggested that if any recommendation regarding fringe benefits package is to be made, it should be done by the end of January, 1982. The FAC met during the Christmas vacation and made its recommendation to the IU and PU Committees on Institutional Affairs.

During the 1981-82 academic year the Joint Educational Policy Committee dealt with the following issues and made the noted recommendations:

- Vice Chancellor's memorandum to the Members of the Computer Science and Technology Task Force, date September 15, 1981. This was tabled and the Vice Chancellor convened the Task Force to discuss the recommendations.
- Placement Exams. Still under discussion in the Vice Chancellor's office.
- 3. Senate Document 81-8 on the formation of a committee to draft uniform academic regulations for IPFW. The EPC recommended that instead of just release time being given that "release time or appropriate compensation" be given the faculty on the committee. This was approved by the Senate. The EPC committee recommended Jim Haw and Rudy Svoboda to serve on the academic regulations committee in addition to the University Editor, Steve Hollander, and the Registrar, Jack C. Dail. The academic regulations committee is at work.
- . Posting of Grades. The EPC requested the Vice Chancellor to send a memo to the faculty advising them of University policy on this issue.
- . New Drop Policy from West Lafayette. The EPC felt no need to change the present policy.
- . Remedial Courses. The EPC recommended that all academic units not accept EDUC X150 or X151, ENG W115 or W116 or W117 or W130, or MA 111 and only 3 hours of MA 149 for graduation credit.
- . IPFW Mission Statement. The EPC forwarded recommendations to the Chancellor through the Senate.
- 8. Phi Eta Sigma. The EPC sent a memorandum to the Vice Chancellor stating that the committee does not endorse Phi Eta Sigma because it appears to lack academic integrity.
- Calendar Adjustment. The committee recommended that on Friday, March 5, 1982, Monday classes meet. This failed in the Senate.
- 10. Parking for Weekend College Students. The EPC recommended they pay the same fees.
