Amendment to SD 88-13 (proposed changes are highlighted)

1.5 The campus committee, consisting of the Chief Acad mic Officer of IPFW as nonvoting chair and seven tenured members of the Fort Wayne Faculty. a majority of whom hold the rank of Professor or Lil rarian, selected so as to provide balanced representation of the disciplinary areas. Voting members of this committee shall be elected to three- ear terms, staggered in the first instance, by the Chief Administrative Off cer of IPFW and the two Speakers of the Faculty. The committee members will be elected from a panel of nominees composed of at least two repres intatives from the faculty of each school/division selected according to procedures adopted by the school/division Faculty and incorporated into the documents which define the protocols of Faculty governance within the school/division. Voting members of this committee shall recuse them: elves from considering cases of candidates from their own depa tments or with whom they share significant credit for research or creative indeavor which is part of the candidate's case. Faculty members shall not serve on this committee in a year when their own cases are pending. The purposes of this committee are to review the actions of the earlier decision levels to assure that the candidate is afforded basic fairness at d due process in accordance with established university policies and procedures and to assess the adequacy and sufficiency of the evidence.

CURRENT TEXT:

1.5 <u>The campus committee</u>, consisting of eight tenured members of the Fort Wayne Faculty, a majority of whom hold the rank of Professer or Librarian, selected so as to provide balanced representation of the disciplinar / areas. Members of this committee shall be selected by the chief administrative officer of IPFW after consultation with the two Speakers of the Faculty from a list of nominees provided by the Faculty of the schools/divisions establ shed under a procedure adopted by the school/division faculty and incorporated into the documents which define the protocols of faculty governance within the school/division. The chief academic officer of IPFW shall serve as nonvoting chair of the committee. The purposes of this committee are to review the actions of the earlier Decision Levels to assure that the candidate is afforded basic fai mess and due process in accordance with established university policies and precedures and to assess the adequacy and sufficiency of the evidence.

Any student who discontinues class attendance and does not meet course requirements shall receive a grade of F for unauthorized withdrawal.
