Prior to the filling of school/division committees considering similar-appl eations, but after consultation with the two Speakers of the Faculty, the Chief A Iministrative Officer of IPFW shall appoint the voting members of this Subcommittive to one year terms from a list of nominees provided by the Faculty of the school idivisions established under a procedure adopted by the school/division Facult and incorporated into the documents which define the protocols of Fa ulty governance within the school/division. Voting members of this Subcommittee will be elected to threeyear terms, staggered in the first instance, by the Chief Administrative Officer of IPFW and the two Speakers of the Faculty from a panel of nominees composed of at least two representatives from the 'aculty of each school/division selected according to procedures adopted by the school/division Faculty and incorporated into the documents which define the protocols of Faculty governance within the school/division. Voting m mbers of this Subcommittee shall recuse themselves from considering cases of candidates from their own department or with whom they share significant dredit for research or creative endeavor which is part of the candidate's case. Faculty members shall not serve
 - Charge. The Subcommittee shall (1) review the actions of the earlier decision levels to assure that the candidate is afforded basic fairness and due process in accordance with established university policies and procedures, and (2) assess the adequacy and sufficiency of the evidence. In order to fulfill their charge, Subcommittee members shall be given early access by the Subcommittee chair to relevant Faculty and university statements on the procedures and criteria governing

on this Subcommittee in a year when their own calle is pending.

Within general guidelines established by the campus administration, the administration, faculty, and staff of each academic unit shall develop written procedures for the organization, conduct, and analysis of the review. By agreement of all parties, the review may be an integral part of a more-general evaluation such as those conducted by an external review or accrediting body. Feedback available from the review shall be provided to the administrative, faculty, and staff participants. The Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs shall report to the Fort Wayne Senate each year concerning the number and general nature of the reviews.

The University Resources Policy Committee recommends to the Faculty Senate the following Tow Policy as recommended by Campus Police Chief Loren DenHartog

- The name of any person (Staff, Faculty, St ident, or Visitor) who has 4 or more unpaid parking violations will be put on the Police and Safety tow list
- The first time the vehicle on the tow list is found on campus, an orange sticker will be placed on the driver's side window of the vehicle. The sticker will state: You have 4 or more unpaid parking violations. If these violations are not paid within 24 hours, y sur vehicle will be towed any time it is found on campus. The sticker will include the date it is placed on the window. A tow list will be kept noting each vehicle tagged and the date the vehicle was tagged.

This policy will eliminate the current practice of sending notification letters to staff, faculty and visitors and will standardize the system for all student, staff, faculty, and visitors

This policy for towing will include any vehicle registered to and driven by the person placed on the tow list. This will eliminate those with mult ple cars who attempt to play games with the police.
