#### Graduating in May? Keep These Deadlines in Mind

Purdue Fort Wayne's 2025 Commencement will take place May 14 at 4 p.m. in the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum.

Here are some deadlines and details to keep in mind if you are planning to participate:

- If you would like to see your name in the commencement program, remember to apply to graduate by March 31. Complete the application in **goPFW** under Registration Tools in the Enrollment section.
- After you apply to graduate, register yourself and your family for the event. Tickets aren't
  needed, but sharing an estimated number of your family and friends who will be attending the
  ceremony and the after-party is very helpful for PFW's advance planning.
- Order your cap and gown. All orders will be shipped directly to the address that you enter, along with a return shipping label. Graduates who aren't planning to attend commencement in May can order a cap and gown for pictures.
- Visit the **commencement website** often for important information, reminders, and updates.
