Purdue Fort Wayne to Honor Featured Faculty for 2025

Four Purdue University Fort Wayne educators will be honored as recipients of the 2025 Featured Faculty designation during a recognition luncheon today. The annual awards are being presented to **Suining Ding**, professor of interior design; **Michael Kirchner**, associate professor of organizational leadership; **Sarah LeBlanc**, associate professor of interpersonal communication; and **Richard Weiner**, chair and professor of history.

Featured Faculty are singled out for their outstanding performance in research, scholarly activity, creative endeavors, teaching, or engagement. As a quality measure that distinguishes PFW from other institutions of higher education, these accomplishments illustrate the comprehensive and significant contributions of the university's faculty in the creation of new knowledge, the fostering of student curiosity, and scholarship of engagement at PFW and beyond.

"Featured Faculty is a competitive award, and the quality of the submissions is high each and every year," said Kimberly O'Connor, associate vice chancellor for teaching and learning. "The faculty at Purdue University Fort Wayne exemplify innovation, dedication, and excellence across

their disciplines. Their work not only advances knowledge and creative practice, but also makes a lasting impact on students, the community, and the broader professional landscape."

Along with being outstanding teachers, this year's four honorees have also done extensive work to better northeast Indiana and the world.

Gurevich Earns Purdue Focus Award

Naomi Gurevich, associate professor in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders, has been named a winner of the Purdue University 2025 Focus Award. Since 2001, the award is given annually to individuals affiliated with the Purdue system who have made an outstanding contribution to the furthering of Purdue's commitment to disability accessibility and the pursuit of excellence. Gurevich joined the PFW faculty in 2017.

Previous PFW recipients of the award were Rama Cousik, associate professor of special education in the Department of Counseling and Graduate Education, who was recognized in 2024, and the Disability Access Center in 2023.



Marketing Guru Collins Drills Deep to Explore What Drives Decision Making

Partly because it was on backorder for two weeks, Wendy Maxwell couldn't wait to read Marcus Collins' "For the Culture: The Power Behind What We Buy, What We Do, and Who We Want to Be." When it finally arrived, she consumed it a couple days later.

"For one, it's not like a regular marketing book," said Maxwell, a Purdue University Fort Wayne junior majoring in accounting. "It takes all of these theories, or ideals, and concepts, and it makes it understandable so a normal person who doesn't have a Ph.D. can look at it."

Even better, Maxwell got to sit in the front row at Collins' Omnibus Speaker Series classroom presentation Thursday afternoon, get her book signed by the author, and then ask him a question during the signature event in Auer Performance Hall later that evening.

Collins, a University of Michigan professor, cultural scholar, and marketing genius, showed why his book is so powerful during riveting discussions with both audiences. His main theme was about perspective and how the way people see the world affects society because of cultural influences. Collins suggested that everyone assumes they have free will, but it is guided by others.
